

November 15th, David Andersen will be playing his 5,000th performance in the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum Conservatory.

The guitar marvel has welcomed over two million guests to the Country Music Hall of Fame since the doors opened in 2001. Between 11am and 3pm on November 15th, Andersen will amaze listeners once again in an extra special moment for himself and the Country Music Hall of Fame. A full-color poster commemorating the event will be available at the performance.

"I am grateful to the Museum for giving me the opportunity to serve our music and our city," David Andersen states. "These 16 years have given me a chance to refine my style and most importantly, become Ambassador of Music City."

This ironman guitar maestro plays six days a week at the Country Music Hall of Fame & Museum, along with other high-profile events every week in Nashville. Each day, Andersen gives every new

friend he meets at the Country Music Hall of Fame his signature guitar picks and a challenge..." remember why they came to Nashville and to take time to enjoy the music they came here to find." Indeed, with this landmark accomplishment and milestone under his belt, Andersen not only remembers but lives and breathes the music of Nashville every day.

A child prodigy reared in Long Beach, Calif., Andersen could play music before he could even talk. He is an accomplished songwriter and proficient on multiple instruments, including the ukulele. As the Ambassador of Music City, Andersen has performed Gospel, Rock, Country, Jazz or Classical music at every single Music City Walk of Fame induction, including the original press conference in 2006. The guitar virtuoso is also an accomplished visual artist and recently completed an impressive *Power Women of Nashville* portrait series, which includes notable names such as Mayor Megan Barry, CEO of CMA Sarah Trahern, philanthropist Martha Ingram, Singer/songwriter Amy Grant and many more.
